In addition to his agricultural leadership, Jeff has served in numerous volunteer roles, including with the Northern Utah Conservation District, Buyers Luncheon Committee, Birdy Day Breakfast, and as a volunteer reading aide in local schools. His service extends beyond titles, as he is widely known for his generosity, mentorship, and willingness to quietly help others whenever needed.

Jeff was born and raised in Fielding, where he learned the values of hard work, service, and community at an early age. He graduated from Bear River High School and went on to work for Thiokol for 36 years, serving as the manager of Final Assembly. Jeff is now retired and enjoys dedicating his time to volunteering and serving others in the community he loves.

After high school, Jeff married his high school sweetheart, Myrna, and they shared 52 years of marriage before her recent passing. Together, they raised five children and are the proud grandparents of 11 grandchildren and two great-granddaughters.
